As many of you know, Kowshika Sankethi Sangha in Karnataka has been serving our community in a big way for a long time, and they have currently undertaken several major projects. Following is an appeal from the President Sri Arkanath, who is on a visit to the USA:

Dear Sankethis of North America,

Wish you and your families a very happy and prosperous new year. I am presently on a private visit to the U.S. to spend time with my daughter's and son's families, and will be here until February 17, 2003. During my stay here, I would like to contact each of you personally to wish you success in your endeavors, thank you for your past support to the K.S. Sangha, and request your continuing generous support for the various community services rendered by the K.S. Sangha. However, since this is a vast country and the sankethi community is quite large, I won't be able to contact each of you individually and hence this letter. I thank the North American Sankethi Association's Board of Directors, especially Dr. M.S, Nataraj, for consenting to publish this letter in the next NASA newsletter.

K.S. Sangha, since its inception on April 24, 1944, has been dedicated to serving the sankethi community, especially in the field of education, by opening several hostels and awarding scholarships to deserving students. The Sangha is presently:

- <u>running seven student hostels</u> two in Mysore, three in Hassan, and two in Shimoga. In these hostels, we provide free board and lodging to about 110 students (60 girls and 50 boys). In addition we provide free lodging to nearly 150 students who share the cost of food among themselves.
- <u>awarding scholarships</u> totaling Rs. 2,00,000 to nearly 150 students each year.
- <u>operating an old-age home (vriddhashrama)</u>, providing free board and lodging to 10 deserving old people of our community.
- <u>awarding old-age pensions</u> to nearly 60 people every month.
- <u>running a well-equipped library in each hostel.</u>
- providing facilities for sports and games in the hostels.
- <u>arranging cultural and literary meets</u> to unearth hidden talents in our students.
- <u>facilitating memorial dinners</u> from the proceeds of endowment funds.

Presently, the Sangha has undertaken three projects:

- <u>Construction of a modern Girls' Hostel building in Mysore to accommodate about 40 students at a cost of Rs. 25,00,000.</u> The building is under construction and will be inaugurated on March 16, 2003.
- <u>Construction of four additional rooms in the Boys' Hostel in Hassan at a cost of Rs. 5,00,000.</u> Smt. Gangamma Keshavamurthy has donated about Rs. 4,00,000 towards this project.
- <u>Construction of additional rooms in the Vriddhashrama building at a cost of about Rs. 10,00,000.</u> The building, which is in Vijayanagar, Bangalore, was donated by Late Dr. K.S. Rajanna.

In addition, it is our desire to **construct a Community Centre in Bangalore**, which has the largest concentration of sankethis, to serve the needs of our entire community.

I hope this gives you a fair idea of the various community service activities that K.S. Sangha has been engaged in. Every year, the Sangha needs over Rs. 14,00,000 to provide these services (Rs. 4,00,000 to

run the free hostels, Rs. 2,00,000 on scholarships, Rs. 1,00,000 each on old age pensions and memorial dinners and Rs. 4,00,000 on employee salaries and other administrative expenses).

K.S. Sangha needs the generous support of all of our community members, especially sankethis who have made their home in North America, to continue providing the above services, and successfully complete the projects described above. I appeal to you to donate liberally to the Sangha. You may send your donations in one of the following ways:

- 1. Make out a check in US Dollars to "NASA" and indicate that the donation is for Kowshika Sankethi Sangha. NASA charges a nominal fee to help offset the cost of processing the donation; please add this to the amount you want to contribute, and mail the check to: NASA, 20017 Doolittle Street, Montgomery Village, MD 20886. You may be able to get U.S. income tax exemption on the donation.
- Make a personal or certified check in US \$ or Indian Rupees to "Kowshika Sankethi Sangha (Reg'd.) Mysore" and mail the check to: K.V. Arkanath, c/o Archana Dhurka, 4068 Banff Court, Plano, TX 75093-2644.

Please use the following guidelines for making contributions for specific purposes:

- Naming a room in the Girls' Hostel in Mysore after you or in honour of a designated relative: Rs. 50,000 or \$1100
- Awarding a scholarship: a minimum of Rs. 10,000 or \$220
- Arranging a memorial dinner in honour of a deceased relative: a minimum of Rs. 10,000 or \$220
- Maintenance of one person in the Vriddhashrama for one year: Rs. 7500 or \$165
- Maintenance of one poor student for one year: Rs. 7500 or \$165
- Old age pension for one person per year: Rs. 2500 or \$55

If you want your donation to be used for a specific project or purpose, please write a note indicating the same.

Please feel free to contact me at 972-312-9795 during my stay in the U.S. I remain grateful to you and your family for your help which will strengthen the service that the Kowshika Sankethi Sangha provides our community.

Paschimavaahini (NASA's bay area chapter) got together for the second time to celebrate sankranthi on Jan 25th. There was an overwhelming response & a great turnout. Almost 40 families (total headcount of about

110) participated & most importantly, all of them were in by 5:30pm to enjoy every single moment. So to say, people were looking forward to it like we do for a munji or maduve in India.

After the welcome announcement, invocation (PurandaraDasa's Vandisuvudadiyali Gananaathana) was aptly sung by Bay area's famous classical musician Srivardhini.

This was followed by distribution of ellu packets by kids. It was wonderful to see all kids in traditional dresses with great enthusiasm to give ellu. Then was the snacks time & when it comes to food, sankethis are second to none!

Then two newly married couple & one set of new parents were greeted on behalf of Paschimavaahini. Also, announcement about NASA & its activities was made.

After that, was a game called Shopping Mall. A list of 15 branded items was handed out to all the wives (different list for each of them). All the ladies sat on one side & shouted out what they needed to shop & the husbands, sitting on the other side, had to list out what their wives wanted.
