2003 Annual Event: July 3-6 at New Windsor Conference Center, New Windsor MD

As in the past, we have secured the entire facility at the conference center. The facility which is very well known to all of you by now is located in a rural environment, about 50 miles west of Baltimore MD. About 180 people may be accommodated in the three buildings, two of which have rooms with attached bath rooms. The buildings are climate controlled including the well appointed huge dining hall. The Center provides beds and pillows, sheets and towels. Please see attached Directions to reach New Windsor.

<u>Food arrangements:</u> We are working with two well known south Indian restaurants in this area to cater delicious food. You will understand that it is not easy to satisfy varying wishes from members ranging from very simple two meals a day with no sweets at all, to full three meals and snacks with good appetizers and sweets! We will try and keep your inputs in mind while finalizing the menu. Please let one of us know if any of you have special needs. We would like to thank Latha Shanthi Ramakrishna, Dr Uma Ramakrishna and Dr Mahalakshmi Nataraj for sponsoring late evening snacks. We welcome sponsors for any other meal or event.

Registration and charges: Details are included in the attached form. We have increased full registration charges for adults by only \$5 to \$130 for adults, but reduced the rates for young adults to \$80 from \$100, while introducing a new category for visitors and students from India at only \$100 to encourage their participation. The key to breaking even is for you to attend in large numbers.

The Activities:

The Board has taken the many inputs and recommendations from last year's Panel Discussion in encouraging Regional Meetings this year, and in coming up with this year's activities. However, as always, we welcome any suggestions from you in this regard. A Program Overview is attached and it will be fine tuned by the date of the event. Following are some of the special programs for this year:

- Music and Dance appreciation sessions followed by concerts in each by well known Sankethi artistes.
- Segment on Hinduism and other religions, and scriptures and Vedic chanting followed by Group Pooja.
- Exhibition of Paintings by two Sankethi painters, and an appreciation session with live demo outdoors.
- General Body Meeting (Updates from last year's panel discussions, Board of Trustees Concept, Sankethi Cruise proposal, Revival of Chiguru, Ideas for the 20th Anniversary Celebrations, etc) while keeping GBM brief, and no elections this year.
- Kannada Movie
- Fireworks (subject to approval by local authorities) sponsored by Dr Jai Rangappa.
- Sports activities including some new events.

DC Area
