Please note that per NASA bylaws only members in good standing as of the Record Date (June 23, 2010) may vote in any formal motion or election of office bearers. The 2009 NASA GBM minutes published in our newsletter Chiguru Volume 26 No. 4, dated 10/31/2009 are included below for your ready reference.

1. NASA General Body Meeting Minutes – July 4, 2009

The 2009 NASA GBM was held on July 4th, 2009 at 10:00am.

- 1. Roll Call Member sign-in sheets were reviewed. Over 50 registered members were in attendance. Quorum was achieved.
- 2. Review of 2008 GBM meeting minutes Minutes from the 2008 GBM were sent to all members in the May 2009 newsletter and were made available at the meeting. Sundaresan motioned to accept 2008 GBM minutes. Dathatri seconded. 2008 GBM minutes were accepted.
- 3. President's address
 - In memoriam:
 - o Ramalakshmi mother of Nagaraj Mysorekar
 - o Videhi Shivashankar, wife of Shivashankar, mother of Seetha (Shivashankar) Aiyar
 - Summary of regional meetings and activities held in the 2008-2009 year
 - o October 2008 Navaratri celebration in Hartford, CT in conjunction with the Hartford marathon
 - o February 2009 Ski trip organized by NASA BOD, including participation by several members and families
 - o April 2009 Ugadi celebrations in Raleigh, NC
 - Charitable activities
 - The President thanked the various donors who have provided support for the Silver Jubilee activities throughout the year. Without their help we would not have been able to have such a great program.
 - Several families were asked to mobilize support for the activites of the Bettadapura Sankethi Sangha (BSS) and the Kowshika Sankethi Sangha (KSS) in India. The Magge family has set up the MS Lakshminarayana Fund to support various KSS activities. The President encouraged other families to emulate this model to set up support funds with BSS/KSS.
- 4. Secretary's report
 - As of 2008 we have 196 life members of record
 - Several newsletters have been sent to the membership
 - This year we started to shift to electronic newsletter distribution to be more environmentally friendly and to save printing and mailing costs. To date, about 25% of the membership has chosen this option.
 - Several Sankethi members experienced the joy of births and weddings over the past year. These have been featured in NASA newsletters.

- It was suggested that the name "Chiguru" be re-instated for the newsletter. This was the name when Mrs. Leela Jagannath was the editor, but for some unknown reasons the name had been dropped. This suggestion was duly noted by the board.
- A motion was made to approve the Secretary's report. This was seconded.
- 5. Treasurer's report only the provisional report was presented at the meeting. Final report of the 2008 financial report will be presented at the 2010 GBM.
 - NASA plans to develop a financial system which will have more consistent documentation for financial transactions. Many cash transactions had been conducted in the past for which records of payment or disbursement were hard to
 - In 2008, NASA received a notification from the IRS stating that filings have not been received. These were duly filed in 2009, and a late filing penalty of \$2214 was paid.
 - A member suggested that Reliance Corporation or an independent CPA be assigned as NASA's tax accountant. This suggestion was duly noted by the BOD.
 - As numbers were still being finalized for 2008, a provisional Treasurer's report was presented to the General Body
 Regarding donations made to NASA for other 3 party entities, NASA will follow IRS guidelines and will try to
 - minimize the delay between the receipt and disbursement of funds earmarked for donation.
 - According to 501c3 regulations, NASA can not donate to uncontrolled organizations
 - NASA's funds have been held in FDIC insured accounts and the money has remained intact we have not suffered a
 - The report made to the GBM was provisional, therefore no motion to accept could be made. Sundaresan advised the BOD to make the final report available to the general body at the next GBM in 2010.

NASA Code of Conduct

- 1. NASA is a family oriented organization in North America.
- 2. NASA get-togethers are meant to encourage free and open interaction among all members so that a permanent bond is developed amongst them.
- 3. NASA must encourage free and open communication among its membership.
- 4. Programs during NASA get-togethers should aim at improving understanding and interaction among its membership with due representation to all age groups while focusing on matters of interest to the NASA community at large such as Sankethi traditions, food and culture in keeping with the aims and objectives of the organization, fine arts (such as music, dance, and drama), creative and literary activities (such as kaavya vaachana), philosophical discourses and discussions on spiritualism (such as lectures and seminars on Hindu scriptures and demonstrations of yoga, meditation, etc.), sports and leisure activities, children's talent shows and most prominently, religious activities (such as group worship and chanting) fall within the scope of the activities undertaken by NASA.
- 5. NASA publications such as periodic newsletters and special souvenirs should not only be vehicles for communication between the NASA BOD and the general membership but also a means of exchange of ideas among all members.
- 6. Formal and informal communications among members (both written and oral, whether held at NASA get-togethers or elsewhere) must follow standard rules such as use of non-aggressive neutral language, mutual respect, respect for the Sankethi / Brahmin culture and heritage, issue-oriented discussion, respect for freedom of expression, freedom to disagree but in a respectful manner, respect for elders and respect for privacy of individuals and families.
- 7. All NASA members shall do everything in their power to instill love and respect for Sankethi identity.
- 8. Personal attacks on others with divergent views will not be tolerated.
- 9. Generational differences among NASA members should be treated much the same as those that occur in each and every family.
- 10. All discussions on NASA related issues shall be strictly confined to NASA members and may not be disseminated to outside parties without the express consent of the appropriate member(s) such as the originator(s) or author(s) and the NASA management and/or the Editorial Committee, if any, constituted by the President, as applicable.

The NASA BOD thanks Dr. Mysore S. Nataraja, Prof. Y.N. Dathatri, Mr. Keshav Sundaresan and Dr Y.N.Jayaram for recommending the establishment of a NASA Code of Conduct. 



From Baltimore:

Take 695W to 795NW to 140W thru Finksburg to Westminster to Rt. 31 (flashing light). Make a left onto Rt. 31. Go 7 miles to New Windsor. Sign is on the right.

From Washington, D.C. and Points South:

Take 495 to 270N & exit Father Hurley Blvd (Rt. 27). Follow 27N thru Damascus (27 curves left here) & Mt. Airy to Taylorsville (Rte 26). Cross over 26, go 2 miles & make left onto Rt. 407. Make right at Rt. 31 when 407 ends. Bear right on 31 as you enter New Windsor. Center is on left about ½ mile.

From Frederick:

Take 70E to Mt. Airy exit, Rte 27N and turn left. Continue on 27N to Taylorsville (Rte 26) & then follow DC directions above.

From Pennsylvania:

Take Rt. 97 or Rt. 27 into Westminster. Take 140W to Rt. 31 and follow the Baltimore directions above.
